Arriving to class on time is just the start. Your participation in class discussions, note taking, timely completion and submission of assignments will be the difference between falling behind or staying ahead.

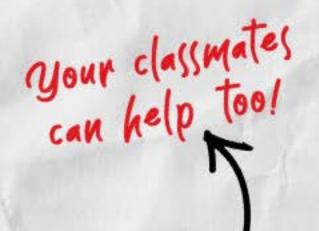
